- 3. <u>Minutes</u>: The minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday, May 26th, 2021 were accepted. There were no Actions arising.
- 4. Chairman's Report [AL]: After the enthusiasm generated by the relaxing of the lockdown restrictions, the current season seems a bit flat. There is good activity within the clubs but little 'county' activity. Partly it is down to the small number of active clubs which makes it difficult to generate any kind of competitive spirit. AL to approach ES to see if it would be possible to run competitions on a Regional basis. There has been little involvement by ES at the county level, their efforts seem to be aimed at the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham. There was the usual debate about value for money from ES.
- 5. <u>Treasurer's Report [KD]</u>: There was no verbal report due to KD's illness. However the summary is as follows. Despite a significant drop in income from leagues and events, we managed to keep the overall loss to a minimum.

Income = £2,465 Expenditure = £3,303.48 Loss = £838.48

6. <u>League Secretary Report [JvH]</u>: <u>Winter 2021/22</u>. In Division 1 there were some great battles but ultimately Martlesham 1 outlasted the other teams and won the division with a game to spare. In division 2 it was an extremely close battle all season between Moreton Hall 2 and Moreton Hall 3, which was decided in their last game between these two outstanding teams. Each team beat the other once, but Moreton Hall 2 managed to get just 2 points more than Moreton Hall 3. No doubt this will be continued at the Supercup. In division 3 Martlesham 3 slowly pulled away from the other teams as one by one the competitors came up short. They were deserving winners of the Division 3 Title.

<u>Season 2022/23</u>. By having 3 leagues and a FA-cup style format, we could consider reducing the League fee and still have "extra" money for trophies, prizes and awards, such as Best Junior of the winterleague, Best female player, e.g....

CL suggested handing out the awards at an evening event next year. JvH thought we might combine this with an exhibition/coaching session with a 'name' to hand out the awards to teams and individuals.

JvH to see if Essex University wishes to join next year's winter league. Kieran, ass. coach at lexden plays there, as well as Henry Booth (Martlesham).

It was agreed that 'light refreshments' would be the offer in the Summer League.

Observations:

- Division 3 a few teams suffered delays in second half partly due to COVID19
- playing levels in all divisions have become more balanced, making wins/results less predictable and more entertaining.
- Division 2 finished on schedule with a minimum of cancellations and no walk-overs.
- Division 1 suffered relatively more cancellations as well as a few walk-overs.
- A few dispensations for players and teams were required this year to enable teams to compete and field teams in accordance with the playing schedule.

- The use of What's app groups by division to share/post results has worked really well both in the Summer as Winter league and will continue.
- Compliments to all captains for their efforts to field teams and minimize postponements to the schedule (reflected in the increase of players that only played 1 match).

Plans and challenges for the near future for the leagues:

1. Revitalize the Supercup format; date to be announced when guidelines allow it.

Moved to early September

2. Maintain/increase participations levels by reviewing or trying new formats(p.e. Over60's competition format)

Developed FA cup style format but unable to plan, will go to 2022-2023, racketball league explored but not sufficient participation as yet.

Publish annual Squash calendar and increase games per team by having two winter competitions, one in 2022 and one in 2023, Play-off between both Winners to determine Winter Champion (if not the same team).

3. Encourage with a minimum amount of rules changes, the impact of postponements or walk-overs on the outcome of the competition.

Experiment in Summer with losing winbonus upon postponements barring exceptional circumstances

- 4. Engage with players, captains and clubs to keep the interest going by always exploring what can be done different or better (survey, transparency, e.g)
- 5. Enable captains to add players, scores and results via their smartphones, which at this moment is limited in its use.
